	The PAG has become a fundraising body and its mandate was to have more of a voice for curriculum matters as well as policy decisions to govern school policies. Many schools are in this position since the policy making has not been a priority over the years. However, some schools are very political and certain items get accelerated due the importance placed on the issue. Certain issues can be presented directly to school trustees as an option.
<b>Parent Feedl</b>	back-Math
	There are generalist teachers teaching math and the strategies they teach are taught through a conceptual understanding format. There are different methods to teach children and this can be done within the class. One suggestion was to take a small group of students from a class to teach them math concepts that they do not understand rather than to overwhelm the students with so many options for strategies. Can this be improved by approaching the principal with our thoughts? Is this a curriculum issue (Provincially set) or a teaching issue (school)? For curriculum changes, do we invite the superintendent to a meeting and lobby for changes to the curriculum? Or perhaps the South-end advisory as another means to approach?

	It appears although the CAP Testing format takes the first couple months of the school year, it is fully entrenched in the school division. Change may come when school trustees begin to retire. Are there any changes that can be made?

	The Science Fair was not well advertised and only 4 students of 475 students presented projects. What can be done?
